STR018-19 Minor Signposting and Linemarking - MAY 2019

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

THAT:

1. The signage and line marking measures listed in Table 1 in the report be approved, in accordance with Plans E1-4, C1-4 & W1-3 attached to the report; and

2. The Public Safety & Lifeguards Unit be advised of Council's decision for enforcement purposes.
3. Due to the proposed changes outlined on Plan C4 being within 1 km of a Nominated Train Station (Sutherland), Council consults with Transport for NSW prior to seeking RMS approval to install No Stopping signs and No Parking signs in Rawson Avenue, Sutherland, in accordance with Part 3 of Schedule 4 of RMS's Delegation to Councils; Regulation of Traffic.

STR019-19 Leonay Street & Vermont Street, Sutherland - Queuing Across Intersection

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

THAT:

1. A 'DO NOT QUEUE ACROSS INTERSECTION' sign be installed in Leonay Street, at the intersection of Vermont Street, Sutherland, in accordance with Plan A attached to the report.
2. Council staff investigate the use of portable variable message signs in Sutherland Shire to educate drivers about Road Rules, including queuing across intersections.

STR020-19 Taloombi Street, Cronulla - parking controls on curve

COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATION:

THAT:

1. 'NO PARKING' be installed on the south-eastern side of Taloombi Street, between the driveways of 2 and 4 Taloombi Street, Cronulla, in accordance with PLAN A attached to the report;
2. The Public Safety & Lifeguards Unit be advised of Council's decision for enforcement purposes.
3. The residents of Taloombi Street be notified of Council's decision before implementation.

General Business:

1. Councillor Croucher reported an issue with the 'NO PARKING VOLUNTEERS EXCEPTED' outside the Salvation Army building in Kiora Rd, Miranda. Drivers have been booked for parking over the weekend. Greg Holding advised that Council staff will consult with the Salvation Army store regarding their parking requirements at this location.
2. Michael Cutrupi requested RMS swap the Loading Zone and the soon to be installed Taxi Zone in Kingsway, Caringbah. Tanmila Samin Islam advised that RMS work instructions have already been sent out for the installation of the taxi zone. Councillor Croucher advised that email representations will be forwarded to Council staff for review and discussion with RMS.
3. Councillor McLean requested that Council staff review the roundabout at the intersection of Cambrai Avenue and Anzac Avenue, Engadine, following complaints from residents about vehicles crossing the lane lines in Cambrai Avenue. Greg Holding advised that the following actions will be undertaken:
 - a. Reinstate the faded linemarking in Cambrai Avenue;
 - b. Consider installing raised pavement markers along the faded linemarking; and
 - c. Review the intersection, particularly the amount of room of vehicles to simultaneously operate in lanes 1 and 2 of Cambrai Avenue.
4. Councillor McLean requested that Council staff investigate the location of a power pole at the intersection of Cambrai Avenue & Wollybutt Road, outside 102 Wollybutt Road, Engadine, following complaints from residents that the power pole is too close to the road. Greg Holding advised that application will be made to Ausgrid to relocate the pole.
5. Councillor Croucher advised that the recently reinstated roundabout at the intersection of Belgrave Esplanade and Murrumbidgee Avenue, Sylvania Waters is working well.
6. Councillor McLean requested an update on a General Business Item from the previous meeting concerning the lack of parking for users of the Mill Creek Mountain Bike Trails. Greg Holding advised that finding a suitable location is the key issue to be investigated.
7. Councillor McLean has received complaints from residents of John Paul Village regarding noise created by motorists using the turning bay in Wilson Parade, Heathcote (near McDonalds). Greg Holding advised that advisory signage will be investigated.
8. Councillor McLean raised concerns regarding the development of the Heathcote Hall site at 1-21 Dillwynnia Grove, Heathcote, due to the weight-restricted bridge on the only access to and from the site, which will necessitate additional truck movements in the area, including past a school. Greg Holding advised that these matters will be taken into consideration when assessing the Construction Management Plan for the site.
