








CGN0707 R	<i>C. japonica</i> 'Mike Witman'		<p>Large peony form up to 12.5 cm across, coral pink with yellow anthers and pale pink filaments. Petals curled and waved, with central ones feathery and twisted among the stamens.</p> <p>1967, Mrs M. J. Witman, Macon, Georgia, US. Reg. No.1034.</p>	June to August
CGN0708	<i>C. japonica</i> 'Fleurette'		<p>Small formal double, light rose red.</p> <p>1949, originated in the US.</p>	July to August

Up to 16 petals, with three petals sometimes a trumpet effect in centre of flower.</p> <p data-bbox="973 1249 1134 1308">1955, Tourje, US.</p>	May to July
