PRESERVING BATE BAY'S BEAUTY AND **CONSERVATION MANAGEMENT**

With stunning beaches and coastal vistas, the stretch from Cronulla to Kurnell is the go-to destination this summer. However, the same waves that draw crowds can lead to short-term erosion and long-term recession, as evident from the East Coast Low major weather event in 2022.

To safeguard our coastline, we work with the NSW Government Soil Conservation Service (which acts as site manager on behalf of Council and Crown Lands) to maintain and manage coastal dune and vegetation.

Turn your bulky tree branches into woodchips. Tree cuttings must be no more than 250mm in diameter and cuttings with sharp thorns or spikes cannot be accepted.

You can even take a load of mulch home with you when you bring a bucket (no bags). The woodchipper will not be on-site on the day.



CHECK YOUR CPR POOL SIGN

Did you know current cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) pool signs are available to purchase from Council's Admin Building?

A CPR sign is compulsory, must be in good condition and able to be read easily from 3 metres.

It is suggested that your sign is displayed near the shallow end or steps of your pool.

If your sign is looking a little faded and hard to read, it's time to replace it.
