

GREENWEB GRANTS NOW OPEN

Owners of private property in the Greenweb network can apply for a grant of up to \$2,000 to restore natural bushland on their property. Ten grants are available for work such as:

- removing invasive bushland weeds
- regenerating and revegetating natural bushland with local native plants
- habitat creation and/or protection.

Greenweb aims to protect and enhance native plant and animal populations by identifying key areas of bushland habitat and establishing interconnecting corridors.
