SWOOPING BIRDS THIS SPRING

For most of the year, native birds are wonderful neighbours. We enjoy their carolling songs and the invaluable ecosystem services they provide, such as seed dispersal and pollination.

During the breeding season, some Australian native bird species can display aggressive behaviour to protect their nesting sites from people, pets or other animals they perceive as a threat. 



LOCAL FERN SPECIES

Our community nursery horticulturists have spent the last 18 months cultivating local fern species. We now have a variety available including Adiantum (Maidenhair fern), Asplenium (Birds Nest fern), Histiopteris (Bats Wing fern), Doodia (Rasp fern) and several varieties of tree ferns.

The method of propagating ferns is guite different to the usual methods of propagation such as seed, cuttings or division. Ferns produce spores on the underside of their leaves. This fine material, almost like dust, is difficult to handle and required a lot of research, a new skill set, and trial and error.

Council will plant these ferns in public places such as Bushcare reserves, and they are also available at the nursery in sizes ranging from tubes to 200mm pots. Tubes can be redeemed with the free seedlings voucher that came with your July rates notice.
