
- 1. Look at the art work. What do you see?

ACTIVITY - Vase of flowers


<u>Materials</u>


- Vase template (see attached)

Step one:

Cut out a vase from the templates provided and glue this in the middle of your page. Leave room at the top and bottom of the page to complete step two and three.


Step two:


Cut and arrange flowers on the top of the vase. Glue these down with your glue stick.

Finish your artwork by drawing in extra details such as flower stems, a table / table cloth and adding colour to the background.


