### WATERWAYS REHABILITATION PROGRAM

In 2012 Sutherland Shire Council completed a watercourse assessment and rehabilitation prioritisation study, which assessed the condition of all the watercourses across the Sutherland Shire.

The results of the study are now the basis of our annual Waterways Rehabilitation and Maintenance Program. Each year we work through a selection of waterways to improve the flow of water and water quality, reduce erosion issues, invasive weeds and the amount of sediment entering our rivers.

This program has already seen amazing positive improvements to so many waterways and will continue in the coming years.
