## **YOUR COUNCIL**

### FORTY-EIGHT PROJECTS RECEIVE COMMUNITY GRANTS FUNDING

Our annual community grants program again delivered funding to a diverse cross section of Sutherland Shire. The program offers financial assistance of up to \$20,000 per project, enabling many dedicated groups to deliver bigger and better programs to serve those within our community.

Thirty-nine local organisations delivering 48 projects received a portion of the available \$500,000. These include specialised services such as aged and disability care, mental health and wellbeing services, social and family support, youth engagement, recreational activities including arts, Aboriginal specific, multicultural programs, and musical initiatives. Recognising the substantial impact that even a modest financial boost can have on not-for-profit organisations, we hope these grants will provide a warm and welcome boost that supports our community.

#### SOLID FUEL-FIRED BBQS NO LONGER ALLOWED IN CROWN RESERVES IN SUTHERLAND SHIRE

In March 2023, Sutherland Shire Council resolved to ban the use of solid fuel BBQs in Crown Reserves in our local government area. These include heat beads, wood, coal and other solid material.

This decision was made after a 3-year trial which unfortunately was not successful. Hot coals and other materials were often left in the reserves causing risk to visitors (especially children) and the environment.

Until the end of January 2024 our staff will be visiting Crown Reserves to advise that these BBQs are no longer allowed. After this date we will be removing the existing coal bins in Gunnamatta Park and Shelly Park.

We realise that some people will be disappointed and we appreciate your understanding of this decision. You are still welcome to use a portable gas or electric BBQ in these reserves.
